Easter Egg Hunt 2011



From the Pastor's Desk

Some people like to think that politics and religion don't mix. They point to our founding documents that support the idea that governments have no place in determining the trajectory of one's religious sentiment. In other words, the government is to stay out of the religion business. From religion's point of view it is equally argued, by some, that religion ought to stay out of the sullyng mess of worldly political endeavors. What are we to do? One suggestion might be to look to the gospel story.

John M. Buchanan, editor of Christian Century suggests in the current issue, that Palm Sunday we just celebrated mirrors the "...irony, celebration and tragedy, shouts of joy and cries of pain and lament..." that are so characteristic of life in our own time.

He goes on to suggest that Jesus, as the central character of the gospel drama, seems to be "...presiding over each act. It's his decision to go to the capital city, Jerusalem, the political and religious center of his people's life, and to go there when the city is full of religious pilgrims and occupying Romans. It's also his decision to arrive in the city in the way a prophet said the Messiah would arrive – on a donkey."

"His intentionality makes it impossible to entertain the notion that the religion that bears his name is not social, worldly and political." Jesus did not merrily walk into Jerusalem naïve and unaware of his actions. I believe all that he did and said during this fateful last week of his life, was the culmination of the whole of his life and ministry.

I believe that something more was happening in the passion of our Lord than we are often willing to acknowledge. I believe that his death on the cross and subsequent resurrection have something to do with my salvation. As the creed says, *"I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended to heaven, is seated at the right hand of the Father, and will come again to judge the living and the dead."*

But here I want you to notice something. I want you to go back to the paragraph above and locate the space after the comma following the words "born of the Virgin Mary." There is much in that space that I fear the early church fathers neglected to mention. All the acts of justice and mercy; all the talk of peace and turning the other cheek; all the partying with drunks and sinners; all the talk of a new reality, a new kingdom, where everyone is welcome to come to dinner; where the extravagant (prodigal) love of a father is the pre-eminent symbol of this kingdom.

It wasn't just because of an old prophetic promise that Jesus was treated as he was from Palm Sunday to the final breath of his earthly life on Calvary – it was precisely because of the life he lived. A life that challenged the stultifying religious values of his day; a life that challenged the prevailing authority of the Roman occupation – Jesus is Lord, King and Messiah and not Caesar (three titles Caesar claimed).

At the very beginning of his ministry Jesus proclaimed, *"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight of the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."* Now you can spiritualize these words all you want, but when the intent of what he said that day became clearer, as people began to connect the dots, even the people of his own town would have thrown him off a cliff (Luke 4:29). How much more, as he began to practice what he preached, did he get noticed by those to whom his new way of life and the teachings of a new kingdom became perceived as a threat to their established order – both religious and political?

Mr. Buchanan finishes his editorial with this: "If we're following Jesus, we can't spend our lives in Galilee. We can't hide behind the popular myth that religion and politics don't mix." What happened on Palm Sunday suggests that we ought to be right in the middle of the debate. I believe he is right!



Worship in May

May 1, 2011 - The 2nd Sunday of Easter

1 Peter 1:3-9; John 20:19-3

Last week was Easter. Jesus has risen from the dead. A whole new way of seeing the world is beginning to dawn on the disciples. Some, like Thomas, doubt the whole resurrection narrative. Others are in despair because so much hope had been invested in Jesus, and now he is gone. What is the trust for the church in the twenty-first century?

May 8, 2011 – The 3rd Sunday of Easter/Festival of the Christian Home and Mother's Day

Psalms 116:1-4, 12-19; Luke 24:13-35

This week we reflect on another of Jesus' post-resurrection appearances – the walk to Emmaus. How could they not have recognized Jesus that day on the road? It makes me wonder if there are times when, just as obviously, Jesus walks with us and we do not see.

May 15, 2011 – The 4th Sunday of Easter

1 Peter 2:19-25; John 10:1-10

As there were in Jesus' own day so today there are competing narratives demanding the allegiance of God's people. We may find the choice that we are called to make a little off-putting when we consider what it means.

May 22, 2011 – The 5th Sunday of Easter

1 Peter 2:2-10; John 14:1-14

Peter talks of Jesus becoming a "stumbling stone" for some who would want to follow him. Over what do we stumble in our efforts to live the servant life of Jesus?

May 29, 2011 – The 6th Sunday of Easter

Acts 17:22-31; John 14:15-21

Idol worship was popular in the first century; a problem that Paul had to directly deal with. We do not set up graven images anymore in our enlightened, post-modern world. Or do we?

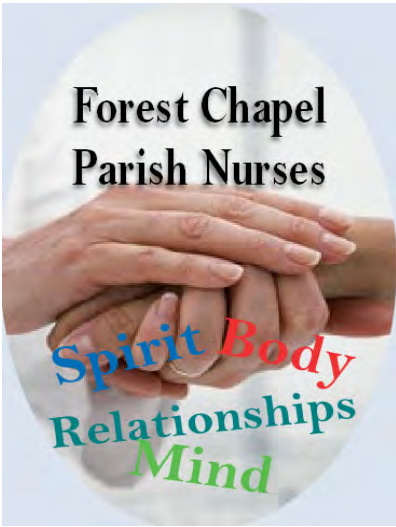

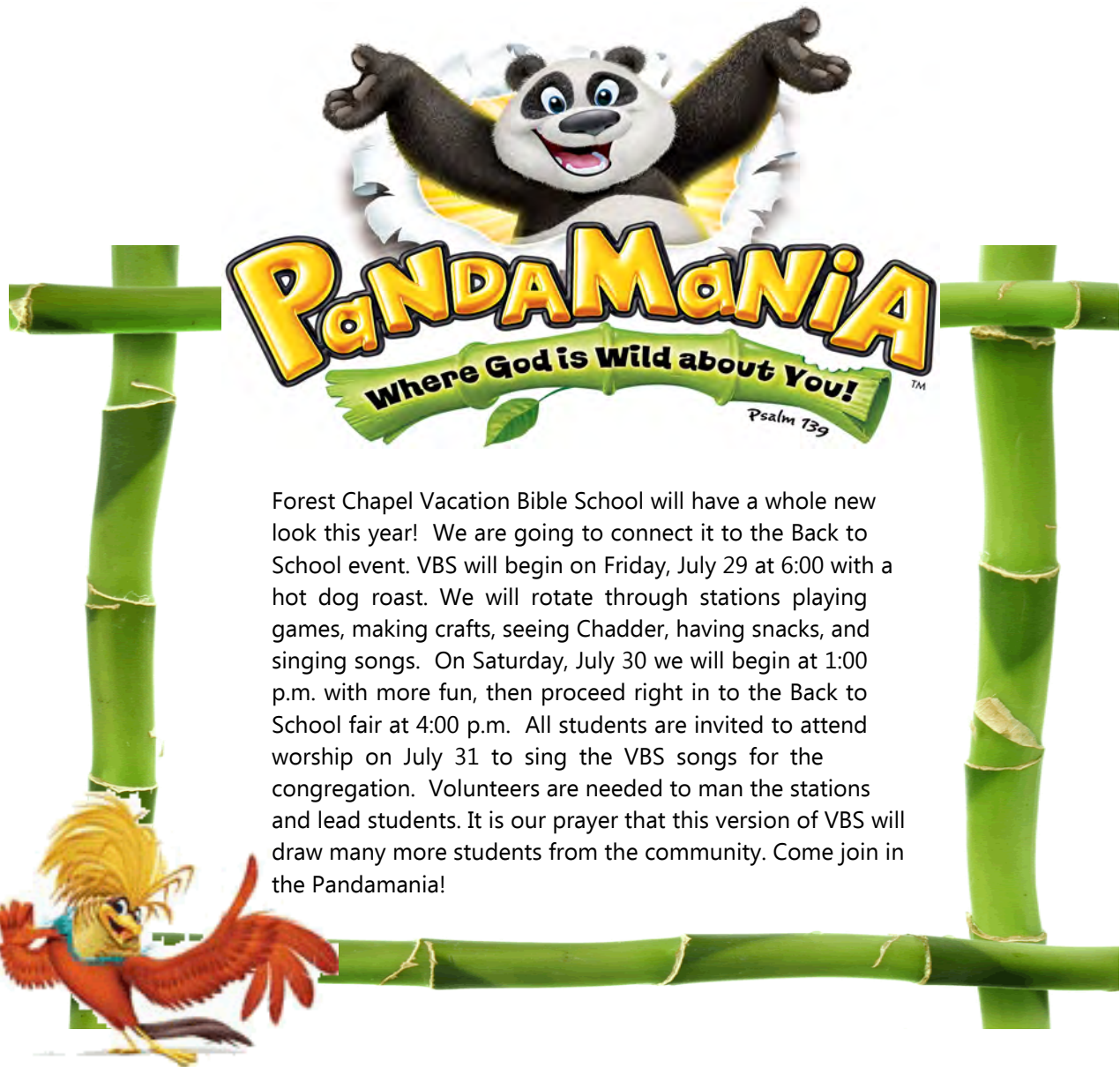


Exercise class is in session on Monday and Thursday mornings from 10-11 am---in the activity room. We would love to have you join us.

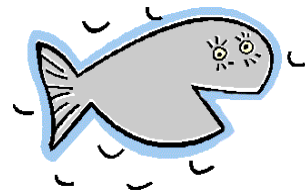

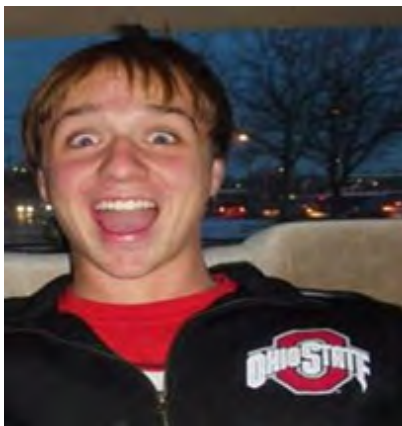


The next Fish Club meeting will be May 22 immediately after worship. Plans are still being formed.

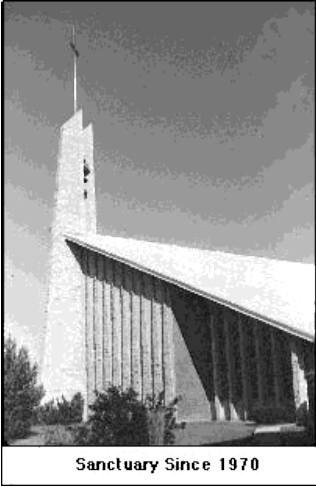
