From the Pastor's Desk

At a meeting earlier this year, the Administrative Council of Forest Chapel approved a motion to embark on a journey of study, open dialogue and prayer that would pave the way for Forest Chapel to become a Reconciling Congregation within the United Methodist connection.

A Reconciling Congregation is one that lives out our United Methodist practice of offering an "open mind, an open heart, and an open door" to all persons who seek us out. It is a congregation that practices "radical hospitality" by which we mean that all persons regardless of their age, gender, economic status, race, nationality, or sexual orientation are welcome to worship, study, fellowship, and join our community as full participants in building up the Kingdom of God.

It has been a dream of mine for years to lead a congregation in this journey. I am glad for the support of the church leadership as we take the first steps this summer towards making this dream a reality.

Some may wonder why this is necessary. A few have even expressed the sentiment that they thought we already were such a congregation. In some respects I understand that view but the Reconciling Congregation movement recognizes that because the larger church still forbids full participation of people based on their sexual orientation, it is important for local congregations to stand with these brothers and sisters and offer them a place at the table of fellowship.

The leadership of Forest Chapel understands that there may well be significant push back regarding this decision as there are strong feelings on both sides of this issue; so we are proceeding deliberately and prayerfully in the months ahead to offer opportunities to study God's word and try to discern its message for our time. We hope there will be significant dialogue that is open, honest, and shared in the Spirit of Christ. We also desire to have the church join in prayer seeking God's guidance as we work through this process.

It has been my pastoral experience during my 42 years of ministry, that there are few families that have not been affected by a child, a relative, or a close friend

finally accepting their sexual orientation for what it is – no longer hiding "in the closet" but embracing and celebrating who they are as a beloved child of God.

I urge all of us to come to this season of discovery with an open heart and mind. I have mentioned several times in the past months in my preaching how the Old Testament prophet Isaiah speaks of "the new thing" that God is doing in the midst of his people. I think for many, this may be a "new thing". My prayer is that in the end we can fling wide the doors of our fellowship to ALL God's children without reservation or restriction.



The choir's spring season is winding down, and soon we will be having special music with vocal and instrumental solos, duets, and small ensembles for summer worship. You will see choir members in some of the musical offerings for the summer. You may also see a new face here and there.

The last Sunday morning for the choir to sing will be June 5. In the afternoon Sally and Jim Harper will host a dinner at their house as the final event of the choir season.

We will see you in the congregation during the summer and will look forward to singing again in September. We hope some of you will come join us in the fall.

June 5, 2011 – Ascension Sunday

Psalm 47; Luke 24:44-55

On this Sunday in the church year, we celebrate the final instructions of Jesus to his disciples. They were told to be witnesses. As they were instructed so are we!

June 12, 2011 – Pentecost Sunday

Psalm 104:24-34, 35b; 1 Corinthians 12:4-13

At Christmas, on birthdays and anniversaries we give gifts. On the day of Pentecost, God began dispensing gifts to the church. If we are going to be witnesses – as we learned last week – then we need the proper tools to get the job done. What is your gift?

June 19, 2011 – Peace With Justice Sunday (Father's Day)

Psalm 8; Colossians 3:12-17

The poetry of Psalm 8 sings of the delight with which God created the cosmos. The poet singles out humans for special emphasis. As the pinnacle of God's creative effort, how ought we to live?

June 26, 2011 – The 2nd Sunday after Pentecost

Genesis 22:1-14; Matthew 10:40-42

The dilemma: In the Old Testament lesson, God seems to be demanding the fleshly sacrifice of Abraham's son while in the Gospel lesson Jesus says that even the simple act of giving a thirsty child a cup of cool water garners substantial "reward" in heaven. Can God have it both ways?

July 3, 2011 – The 3rd Sunday after Pentecost

Romans 7:15-25a; Matthew 11:16-19, 25-30

Have you ever thought to yourself, *"I don't know what got into me,"* when you do or say something out of character? When children are caught *with their hand in the cookie jar* they are always sorry; not for taking a cookie, but that they got caught. Paul understood.

July 10, 2011 – The 4th Sunday after Pentecost

Psalm 119:105-112; Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23

Today's lesson on horticulture is brought to you by the Galilee Seed and Grain Co. whose spokesperson, Jesus, shares some informative information about farming. This is a two part presentation. See next week for part two.

July 17, 2011 – The 5th Sunday after Pentecost

Psalm 139:1-12, 23-24; Matthew 13:24-30, 36-43

July 24, 2011 – The 6th Sunday after Pentecost

Romans 8:26-39; Matthew 13:31-33, 44-52

The kingdom of heaven seems like it is worth the price but what about that "furnace of fire?"

July 31, 2011 – The 7th Sunday after Pentecost

Matthew 14:13-21

"Jesus had compassion on them..." Do we need to hear more? He healed their sick, he fed them, he taught them; this is our example.

August 7, 2011 – The 8th Sunday after Pentecost

Romans 19:5-15; Matthew 14:22-33

What does it mean *"...to call on the name of the Lord."* Do we only call when we are drowning, as Peter does in the gospel lesson or can we see the presence of the Lord in all the moments of our lives?

August 14, 2011 – The 9th Sunday after Pentecost

Romans 11:1-2a, 29-32; Matthew 15:21-28

Jesus has a change of heart!

August 21, 2011 – The 10th Sunday after Pentecost

Romans 12:1-8; Matthew 16:13-20

Who is Jesus and why does it matter? And what does that have to do with not being *"conformed to this world?"*

August 28, 2011 – The 11th Sunday after Pentecost

Romans 12:9-21; Matthew 16:21-28

Paul's instructions to the Roman church ought to be the "marching orders" for followers of Jesus in every generation.



September 11 Remembrance

The 10th anniversary of the horrific events that happened on September 11, 2001 will be remembered later this year. September 11, 2011, is on a Sunday. To honor those who serve the nation and our communities with a sacrificial heart we will be presenting the book, *Strength for Service to God and Country* to members of the Greenhills/Forest Park Fire and Police departments and to our Metro Park Rangers.

Quoting from the website: ***Strength for Service*** was brought back to life in 2002 by an Eagle Scout named Evan Hunsberger. After discovering a worn copy of the volume that had belonged to his World War II Corpsman grandfather, Hunsberger devoted himself to the republishing of ***Strength for Service***. (This task became his Eagle Scout service project) The original book had been published in 1942 by Abingdon-Cokesbury Press, an imprint of the Methodist Publishing House. A popular devotional for armed forces personnel during World War II and the Korean conflict, one million copies of ***Strength for Service*** had been distributed before the book fell out of print in the 1950s. Updating its contents only slightly to reflect contemporary language and culture, the newly republished volume remains true to its original spirit while adding reflections and devotions from contemporary religious leaders.

Since the book's re-release by Cokesbury (our United Methodist Publishing House) in 2002, more than 445,000 books have been distributed world-wide. A copy of the book can be purchased for \$7.00. We need quite a few copies for distribution to the above-mentioned service personnel.

We need to collect this money by the end of July to allow enough time for shipping. Will you help provide hope and comfort to those who serve us so tirelessly?

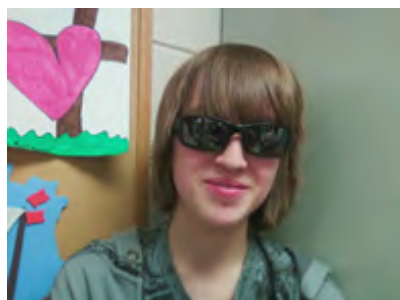

Church Financial Update

The financial report from April is in and we continue to tread water.

Total income through the end of April is down about \$7,900 from last year, almost matching the \$8,167 reduction in internal expenses over the same period.

Connectional giving to the Conference and Distinct is down by about \$1,200.

We are currently operating at a cash flow deficit of about \$14,000 which is about

\$1,500 less than we were at this time last year. If you have the flexibility, please consider paying a portion of your yearly pledge in advance to help reduce the cash flow shortage.

A copy of the current financial report is always posted on the bulletin board outside the church office. Summer Mission Devotion

“Jesus answered, ‘Unless I wash you, you will have no part of me....Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another’s feet.’” (John 13)

Only the lowest of the lowly servants were to wash the feet of a guest who entered a home. So, you can imagine how the disciples felt when Jesus began washing their feet! How can they tell if we are Christians? First... by our thoughtfulness, our kindness, our generosity. Make them wonder what it is in our life that brings us such peace and joy. Then, when they ask, be prepared to tell them, *I have this friend named Jesus who has made all the difference in my life. Let me tell you how...*

- **Identifying your own gift for ministry** and responding with action

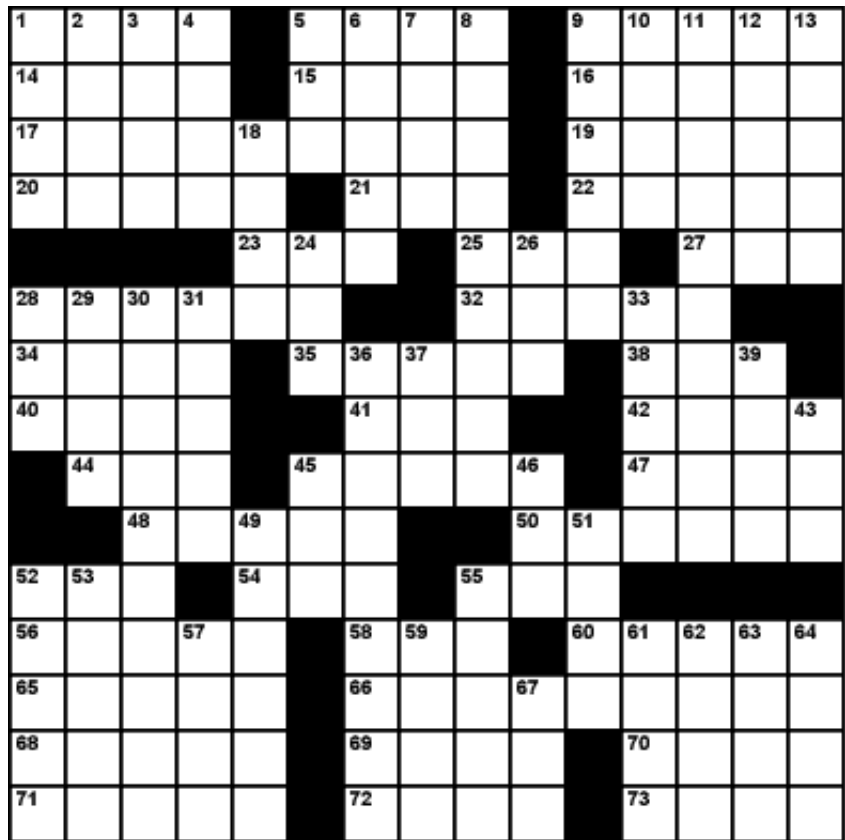


Fourth of July Crossword Puzzle

Letter from the Congregation

Sally Stahlgren wishes to thank all those who remembered her at the time of her sister's death with cards, letters and prayers.

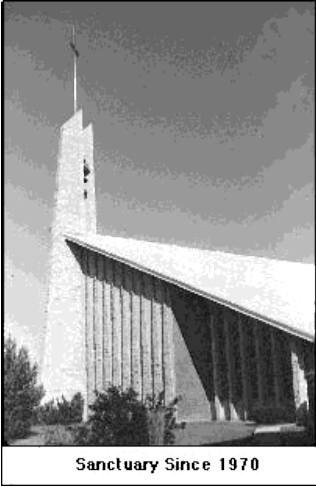
